2. Approval of Parish Council Minutes 21st April 2014

The minutes for the meeting on 21st April 2014 were approved by Cllr Peaster and seconded by Cllr Bartlett

3. Village Hall Report

Cllr Barrow and Cllr Peaster have attended most of their meetings during the last year and have worked hard in helping the Village Hall & Recreational Committee on a couple of projects that we hope to see finished this year, the purchase of some extra land for car parking adjacent to the recreation field and also the refurbishment of the local play area.

4. Bridle path Update

There were no updates on this, the whole thing is being reconsidered and we will have a revised consultation paper as soon as possible.

5. Recreational Park Update

Clerk had sent the application of for RLT2 funding and has had confirmation that this has been approved and we have been awarded £2946. Clerk has also finished the application form for Viridor Credits and this has been sent off. The next cut off date is 7th July and applicants will know the outcome within 10 working days.

6. Meeting Open to Public Discussion Time

Mrs Rebekah West joined us tonight on behalf of the AONB as the newest ranger, explaining that she has now been with the AONB for about 3 months. Previous to this she worked for Caerphilly County Borough Council as an Apprentice Countryside Ranger in the Countryside Parks. One of her first jobs since joining the AONB team has been the swaling on the Quantocks. This year they have done less than they planned to, but in October they will re-commence.

At the recent JAC meeting, Helen Booker joined them from the RSPB and was pleased to report that the heathland birds are doing really well but there seem to be less sightings of the Whinchat. If any members of the public do happen to see any Whinchat could they please contact Rebekah on 01823 451884 to report the

location.

The deer count this year has now been done and the AONB are pleased to say that the count is up 20% from last year. A total of 511 has been recorded this year which is good news.

The Exmoor Pony Herd at Cothelstone Hill are now getting old and

unfortunately there was an incident last week with one of the ponies

standing away from the rest and generally looking unwell. A vet was called in and it would seem that the pony concerned was 30 years old and had lost her teeth. The most humane outcome was for the pony to be put to sleep. This leaves a remaining 9 ponies.

Up at Cothelstone Hill work will soon start to protect a scheduled monument which is a heritage feature thought by English Heritage to be a medieval pillow mound.

The monument currently has a clump of beech trees growing on it, so work will

involve removing these trees over the next 4 years and a

replacement clump being planted nearby, away from the heritage assets. These beech trees are not the original Seven Sisters beech trees but the small clump of trees nearby.

Rebekah commented about the amount of fly tipping that seems to be around at the moment, especially tiles from bathrooms and kitchens. This will be monitored and fines will be implemented if caught.

There also seems to be an increase in off roading at Triscombe, especially at

Wilmot's Pool. They are in the process of working out what defences to put into place that wont disturb the environment. Perhaps bollards or motion sensor cameras.

Rebekah was very pleased to announce that The Quantock Hills now have a Wildlife Crime Officer, PC Rob Jacobs.

It was also mentioned by one of the Cllrs that now there is a parking meter at Ramscombe there seems to be a lot more sightings of people having BBQs on the open common instead. This is very dangerous and can cause so many risks.

Cllr Curtis thanked Mrs West for joining us.

7. Matters Arising

On-Line Banking

Clerk explained to the Cllrs that we can now have internet banking which would make keeping up to date with the accounts much more easier but would need the approval of the Council to do this. Proposed by Cllr Tully, seconded by Cllrs Barrow, Rees, Peaster, Cavill, Bartlett and Chairman.

8.Any Other Business

County Councillor Edney mentioned that the new roundabout that is being constructed on the A39 Quantock road between Sandford Hill and Danesboro Road is ahead of schedule. They are hoping to be open for the May bank holiday to ease the congestion but then close again. They are hoping to open fully the middle of June.
