### The Coleridge We Don't Know...

Samuel Taylor Coleridge lived in Lime Street in Nether Stowey for three years. In his time spent here he wrote some of the most beautiful and famous poems in the English language and collaborated with William Wordsworth on a book of poems called *The Lyrical Ballads*, giving birth to the English Romantic period.

A less well-known fact about Coleridge is that he suffered all his life with a painful rheumatic condition. This disease came and went with flares that gave him swollen joints, bowel problems, periods of extreme lethargy and inflamed eyes. Nowadays this would probably be recognized as some sort of auto-immune condition, possibly Systemic Lupus Erythematosus. SLE or Lupus is a chronic, inflammatory, variable autoimmune disease of connective tissue, typically characterised by skin rash, fatigue, joint and muscle pain and often by disorders of the blood, kidneys, heart, lungs, and brain.

It is hard, of course, to try and diagnose the diseases of people who are long deceased. Some modern biographers wonder if Wordsworth's daughter, thought at the time to be suffering from tuberculosis, was, in fact, anorexic. The same has been said of Elizabeth Barrett Browning, both women who were controlled so strongly by overbearing fathers that the only thing they could control themselves was their eating habits and their weight.

One of the problems is that the terminology has changed so much: Coleridge refers to symptoms such as *flying gout, dysentery, inflamed eyes* and episodes of *rheumatic fever*.

Lupus sufferers will recognise these symptoms as joint and/or muscle pains, IBS, dry eyes. And the episodes of *rheumatic fever* with joint pains and


overwhelming fatigue sound like a "flare" (a time when the disease is particularly active)

His symptoms are often attributed to opium addiction. And there is an element of truth in this. Coleridge's extreme constipation was certainly caused by opiates: any modern day user of Codeine will testify to this. But it is important to remember that opium or laudanum were the only painkillers available at that time. Many people took laudanum for pain relief but not everyone became an addict. In the same way as many of us like an alcoholic drink but we're not all alcoholics. Coleridge recognised the recreational effects of the drug, he even knew he was becoming an addict, but he was powerless to resist. He was a complex character: an addictive personality, possibly what we would term nowadays bi-polar, with bursts of high creative industry and grand schemes followed by periods of indolence.

But did he have Lupus? Of course we will never know. But the more I read about him, the more I am convinced that he might have done.

🖈 Local Nether Stowey resident, William Husband, was thrilled to learn 🖈 last month that he had been awarded an MBE for Services to Young People in the Queen's Birthday Honours List. He has served almost 30 years with numerous Combined Cadet and Army Cadet Forces around the country and is currently one of the Devon Army Cadet Force's Vocational Qualification Officers.

With no military background (bar his university years in the Officer Training Corps), his interest in the Cadet Force started whilst he was teaching at a school in Lancashire in 1992. On his return to Somerset, 🛴 he joined the Devon Army Cadet Force as there were no available 🛬 ★ openings in Somerset. He explained to me that the Army Cadet Force ★ 🖈 is not a recruiting organisation for the Army, it is a youth 🖈 organisation run by the Ministry of Defence. Open to all secondary school children, it is part military training and part adventure training. Young men and women learn not only rock climbing, kayaking and orienteering skills (amongst many others) but also rifle shooting and a multitude of military skills not taught in other youth clubs!

William's role over the past 10 12 years has been delivering vocational training to the cadets. All cadets pass Army Proficiency Certificates, but these are not necessarily understood in the 'civilian world'. William coaches and supports the cadets to gain equivalent \* ★ qualifications through the Business & Technology Education Council ★ (BTEC) and Institute of Leadership & Management in subjects \* ranging from public service to leadership to music. He is one of the 🛪 longest serving and highest performing practitioners in his field, having helped nearly 400 cadets achieve their qualifications.

"For some cadets, these qualifications will simply help them to stand 🖈 riangleright out from the crowd when applying to university or for jobs. However, for others, the BTEC or ILM certification may be the qualifications these young people achieve. It is immensely rewarding 쳐 to see the positive impact that my colleagues and I have on their 🕏 tives." ☆ ★ He readily admits that the past 18 months of Covid restrictions and ★ ★ lockdowns have been very difficult, with all training being done on ★ than would normally take part and it has been much more difficult to engage with the students. #### SOMERSET NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

The Minor Injury Unit (MIU) located at Minehead Community Hospital will temporarily close overnight, from 9pm until 8am, for four months from Thursday 1 July. The service will remain open from 8am – 9pm, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

During the daytime and evening hours (predominantly from 8am – 9pm) all of the MIUs in Somerset provide a full clinical service led by emergency nurse practitioners and supported by other clinicians such as specialist physiotherapists and paramedic practitioners. Working together they provide a full clinical service. 96% of those who seek treatment at an MIU in Somerset receive all the treatment, support and advice they need on their first visit and do not need to come back or be referred for treatment elsewhere.

The MIU in Minehead is the only one that is open overnight. From 9pm until 8am the service that is offered is different. It is staffed by one paramedic and one healthcare assistant. The overnight paramedic primarily acts as a care navigator, they are not a senior clinical decision maker and therefore unable to assess, treat and discharge patients independently.

This means that patients attending the Minehead MIU overnight receive appropriate first aid if that is needed and are advised to either return for a detailed assessment and treatment the following day or are referred to the Emergency Department at Musgrove Park Hospital. As a result, the majority of patients who attend the Minehead MIU overnight need to return the following day or are referred elsewhere.

While the MIU in Minehead provides a well-used service during the day, it is used much less overnight. The average number of patients seen overnight by a paramedic over the last 3 years is less than one patient a night (0.9) on average.

If you have a minor injury or you're unwell, NHS 111 will make sure you get the right help from the right service. For serious and life-threatening conditions, call 999.

# Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update



### A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C.



The MEH team is celebrating a major milestone as they take their first steps to install electrical works in the first reactor's Electrical Building. The Electrical Building will house key equipment for incoming power from National Grid, before it is distributed to different areas of Hinkley Point C, including instrumentation and control systems.

MEH is the next major phase of the project and stands for Mechanical, Electrical and HVAC (Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning).

Our 15 Turbine Generator (TG) columns are a striking feature on site and are in place to support the Turbine Hall building. As construction progresses, the columns have been surrounded by another large structure which will hold the weight of 2,500m3 of concrete until it sets, and is specifically designed to make sure it does so evenly.



Once the concrete is poured, it will create the table upon which the turbine and turbine generator will sit.

Throughout the pandemic our priority has been on keeping our workforce and local community safe. Following the easing of restrictions across England on the 19th July, we have been cautiously adjusting our own Covid-19 measures in line with Government advice whilst also remaining vigilant of the risks that exist.

Our offices, canteens and busses are returning to full capacity, but we will be maintaining many of the protection measures that are in place today. We are also maintaining our testing capability with our own facility continuing to perform targeted and asymptomatic testing. New starters and those returning to work will also have to provide a negative test result before commencing work.

### **OBITUARIES**

## Brian Williams, 14<sup>th</sup> March 1942 - 20<sup>th</sup> June 2021

Brian died peacefully after a short illness at his home in Nether Stowey. His funeral service was held in Nether Stowey Church on 5<sup>th</sup> July and was conducted by our assistant rector Kate Sax. Brian's son, Scott, read a poem by Shakespeare called 'Come to Dust' and Gemma read the lesson.

The funeral cortege had started from Castle Stores in Castle Street which Brian and his wife, Barbara, had run for many years. Many villagers had gathered there to follow the hearse down through the village collecting more people on the way. A jazz band led the procession playing '76 trombones' all the way over the by-pass to the church. They continued to play outside the church as the mourners went in and did the same as they came out after the service.

Kate Sax gave an address saying that all those present had known Brian as a humorous and kindly person. He was a gifted horseman but most of all, a showman. Brian had previously written computer software for the Building Industry but decided to 'join the retail industry' by opening Castle Stores in 1997. He and Barbara retired about 18 months ago. Brian will be remembered for his creative productions of 'Oliver', which raised funds for our school, and the 'Quantock Musical Theatre Company' which put on shows in many local venues. He had a charismatic personality. The printed 'Order of Service' had photos of his past activities with the last photo showing Brian in his full Shakespearean costume. A very fitting way to remember him.

After the service, Brian's coffin was taken to Sedgemoor Crematorium for a brief farewell attended by his immediate family and Revd. Kate Sax. Funeral arrangements were by Grandfields and donations were for St. Margaret's Hospice and district Nurses.

# David William Worthy, 23<sup>rd</sup> December 1938 – 25<sup>th</sup> June 2021

David died peacefully on 25<sup>th</sup> June at his nursing home in Dawlish, Devon. He was 82 years old.

His funeral service was held at Sedgemoor Crematorium on 12<sup>th</sup> July and was conducted by a lady celebrant, Vivian Drake. Classical music was played and poems by Shakespeare and Samuel Taylor Coleridge were read. David's brother Richard gave a tribute which forms the basis of this short obituary.

David was the first of four children and was born in Essex but the family moved to Nether Stowey at the beginning of the war when his father was

posted to man searchlights on the Quantocks. David went to a boarding school where he proved to be extremely academic. He could have gone to Oxford or Cambridge University but joined a firm of Estate Managers in London where he developed a love of house plans and architecture. He also became interested in both classical music and English Folk music, the bawdier the better! David developed a love for the 18<sup>th</sup> century indicating that studying at an Art School might have been more rewarding. He owned an MG TD sports car for a while. David also shot many family films on his 8mm cine camera. He was a talented wood worker and had collected many books on carving, sculpture and art. He had written several books about the Quantocks, all lavishly illustrated with photos from his collection. David was very much an historian having traced his family tree right back to 1691.

David was very social but happy living alone. He was often seen in the village shopping at Littles' Store accompanied by his two rather boisterous Jack Russel terriers. The funeral arrangements were by Gilbert & Son and donations were for Nether Stowey Church.

### Jane Caroline Marshall, 3<sup>rd</sup> February 1962 – 5<sup>th</sup> June 2021

Jane was the wife of Craig Marshall, a previous rector of our parish. They lived for many years here bringing up their family but finally moved to Yorkshire. However, they loved their time here and Jane had requested that her funeral service should be held in Nether Stowey Church followed by burial in the nearby cemetery. The service was held on Wednesday  $23^{rd}$  June and was conducted by our rector Eleanor King under the current covid restrictions. The church music group provided the music and Revd. Craig Marshall gave a tribute to Jane. At the time of writing this obituary, details of Craig's words are 'locked' inside a broken computer which should be mended before the September Messenger is printed. Music to come in by was a Mozart piano concerto and music to go out by was 'Baby, I Love You' by The Ronettes. Music to remember Jane was 'What a Wonderful World' by Louis Armstrong. The committal took place at the graveside in the cemetery.

Funeral arrangements were by Grandfields and donations were for St. Michael's Hospice in Harrogate.

## Dear Everyone,

When I was a teenager, and that was a few years ago now, and attended the church youth club, I can remember the leader describing prayer as being like talking to God over the phone – like a conversation. God always answered

the phone call, always listened and you would always feel hopeful when the call came to an end. .... And you could phone Him whenever you like, it didn't cost more in the daytime or night-time; it was free!

Over the last couple of months, I have had to make a few phone calls reporting the passing of my husband. It has been hard in many ways, but made more challenging by each call presenting me with a variety of options: press 1 for advice on a product, 2 for answering order queries, 3 to cancel your order and 4 to change a delivery address ······. and I waited for the fifth option that I expected to say – 'If you need something else then please hold the line'. Number 5 never comes - just the words 'you have failed to enter a number', and if you are fortunate the options will be repeated. And of course, the call is recorded for training purposes!

We often feel as though there is a 'trick' to navigating such a phone system, and wish someone had told us which words to say and which buttons to press. Prayer can sometimes feel like that - we think that we need training to pray, that we have to pray in 'God' language, using words and phrases that we don't really understand; or that God hasn't time to listen to me or that God can be found at the end of the 'number 5', which is never answered.

The answer to all these thoughts is simply 'no'. God hears our prayers however, and whenever, we pray – a single phrase of prayer in a moment of time; - a rambling prayer sharing our thoughts and what is on our hearts; an 'asking' prayer for others or ourselves, a prayer requesting healing of a family member or friend who is ill or in trouble.

And God has time for everyone, that is you and me, and he does not take time off.

Sometimes God might take longer than we might expect to answer a prayer or not answer prayers in the way we hope, and that is hard. We just need to keep on praying, asking for understanding and trust that he knows what we are going through.

If God did have a phone number, I have no doubt that it would be a direct line, promptly answered, and free! But you do not need to phone to pray, God is ready to hear our prayers wherever we are.

if you haven't prayed before, just try it. As the 'Try praying' poster says – it might be easier than you think.
