



Be a responsible dog owner this spring

As the snowdrops are emerging and the trees come into bud it is a great time to visit the Quantock Hills. The hills are a wonderful place to explore with your dog and many people love to visit with their four -legged friend.

But please remember that it is at this time of year when livestock such as sheep and lambs are at their most vulnerable. Quantock Hills AONB Rangers, local farmers and the Police would like to highlight the problems that some dogs can cause to livestock and wildlife on the hills and in farmland.

Quantock Hills AONB Manager, Iain Porter said: "For many of us our dogs are part of the family and since the pandemic dog ownership in England has increased by nearly 40%. With more people and more dogs accessing the countryside there is the potential for more incidents of dog worrying. We want people and their dogs to visit the Quantock Hills and to do so in a responsible way, by following the Countryside Code and being aware of where their dog is at all times and having them under close control."

From 1st March – 31st July dog owners are required by law to keep their dogs on a lead when being walked across Open Access land including the open Quantock hilltops and combes. In all other areas of the countryside dogs should be kept under close control. It's not just the physical attacks that cause harm but simply allowing a dog to chase sheep may cause ewes to abort or become injured.

Andy Stevenson, Quantock Hills AONB Ranger said: "We'd like to take this opportunity to remind all dog owners to please keep their dogs on leads when walking close to lambs or sheep. Even if lambs are not present in a flock, the ewes may well be pregnant and a dog causing them to run or chasing them could cause them to abort".

There have been many times when Quantock farmers have had to deal with the aftermath of dog attacks on sheep and in all cases, they could have been easily avoided.

Quantock Farmer and Chairman of the Quantock Commoners Association, Anthony Salvidge said: "Livestock worrying can be devastating

causing distress to animals and to farmers. For me it is the worst part of farming the hills, getting that call and going to pick up a sheep which has been ripped to pieces. After the distress and suffering there are also the financial implications of having your animals treated or in the worse cases the loss of that animal."

1st March and 31st July, keeping your dog on a lead on Open Access Land is also to protect ground nesting birds, as dogs run about in the undergrowth they flush birds such as Nightjars and Skylarks off their nests and may cause them to abandon them.

If your dog does kill or cause harm to livestock, you can be liable for a significant fine and for the value of the livestock harmed - your pet may also be dispatched, the cost of which will also have to be borne by you. Moreover, if your dog is seen worrying livestock farmers can shoot them.

If you witness an attack in progress, call **999** otherwise any incidents witnessed should be reported to the Police on **101**.

Gardening with Nick - April 2023

What a mixture of weather we had in March.

Following an unusually dry February we have already had rain, frost and as I write snow! This should be a busy month particularly in the vegetable garden and hopefully we will get some quality spring sunshine to warm the soil required for good germination and plant establishment. Remember to look after your soil and avoid working on it if is too wet. It is important to avoid compacting the soil which can lead to poor drainage and root run.

Vegetables: it is time to plant potatoes, first, second early and towards the end of the month maincrop varieties. If you were tempted to plant earlies last month it is important to earth up new growth if it has appeared in order to protect it from possible frosts. It is the month when many vegetables can be sown direct into prepared soil such as peas, beetroot, lettuce, spring onion, radish, spinach, carrot, Swiss chard and parsnip. In prepared seed beds or alternatively into modules leeks, Brussels sprouts, summer cabbage, calabrese and summer and autumn cauliflower can be sown and later transplanted. With crops such as lettuce, salad leaves, spring onions, radish and parsley smaller successional sowings are beneficial to provide continuity of supply. Seedlings of rocket, radish, turnips and cabbage are very susceptible to Flea beetle recognised by small holes appearing in the seed leaves and foliage. Protection can be given by covering with fleece or very fine mesh such as enviromesh. A good month for planting asparagus crowns in prepared beds. If you don't like Brussel sprouts and or Kale do try Kalettes. A cross between sprouts and kale but where sprouts

would appear you get frilly rosettes tasting more like spring greens -delicious!

The greenhouse: if the greenhouse has not had a thorough clean now is the time to do it: cleaning the glass, framework and benches etc. will pay dividends prior to sowing frost tender crops such as French and runner beans, sweetcorn, courgettes, marrows and squash. These will be ready to plant outdoors once the risk of frosts has gone. The greenhouse will also be prepared for planting tomatoes, cucumbers, aubergines and peppers. The better the quality light entering the greenhouse the better the quality of growth.

Ornamentals: as spring flowering bulbs go over remove the old flower head so that energy is not wasted developing seeds and leave the foliage to die back for at least six weeks which allows time for the bulb to be replenished ready for next year. Dormant dahlia tubers can be planted out and any new growth should appear after the risk of frost has gone. Alternatively start the tubers off in boxes of compost in the greenhouse and the first shoots can be taken as cuttings and then the tubers planted out. Herbaceous perennials can still be divided with the old woody parts rejected in favour of young vibrant growths. Take the opportunity to clean through the border remove any perennial weed and apply a general-purpose fertiliser such as growmore or blood, fish and bone. A mulch, 50-75mm (2-3" deep) will help conserve moisture and provide some weed control, particularly annual weeds. Now is a good time to move or plant evergreens as long as the ground is not too dry or waterlogged.

Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update

A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C



The first new nuclear reactor for a British power station for more than 30 years

At just 13-metres long and weighing 500-tonnes, the "reactor pressure vessel" will create the heat needed to make steam for the world's largest turbines.

It is the first of two nuclear reactors which will be installed at Hinkley Point C. Each reactor will help provide enough low carbon electricity for 3m homes.

The reactor travelled from France to Britain arriving at Avonmouth Docks, before being transported by barge to Combwich Wharf. The final stage of the journey was a 5 hour trip for 4 miles by a transporter to the construction site.



At the February 2023 meeting it was confirmed that a site meeting with the Highways Department would take place in March. However, due to the snow, this has been postponed until April. It is hoped that all issues will be discussed fully and an action plan formulated with timescales for any work that is agreed – further details will be given once they are available. In the meantime if you notice any problems on the roads that need reporting, you can do this online at the Somerset County Council web page Report A Problem on the Road or at Fix My Street.

Two new grit bins have been purchased by the Parish Council and are at the March Mills crossroads and Bincombe Green They were both in situ before the snow came, so may have been in use already.

On other matters, the Clerk has been contacted by the supplier of the defibrillator as it needs a software update. The dates for this are still to be confirmed and when they are, notices will be put up to inform people of the removal of the unit and the location of the next closest defibrillator (which is at the Quantock Medical Centre in Nether Stowey).

Also, the Over Stowey Village Hall and Recreation Ground Committee have informed the Parish Council that on Sunday 7th May 2023 – over the Kings Coronation weekend - they will be holding a sheep racing fund raising event at the cricket ground in Over Stowey to bring the community together. At the April 2023 meeting the Parish Council will consider how they can contribute towards the day.

By the time this is published, the vesting day for the new unitary authority will have taken place. Please visit the <u>New Somerset</u> <u>Council</u> website for further information.

The next Parish Council meeting is scheduled for April 19th 2023 and the Annual meetings will be held in May as usual. Dates to be confirmed. Please check the website and notice board for details.

News from The Quantock Medical Centre April 2023

A Little Piece about Helen Every's Nursing History

Helen is a third-generation nurse. Her mother Joyce was a nurse and midwife as was her mother, Helen's grandmother, Florence.

Helen started her training in 1980 aged 17. She trained as an orthopaedic nurse at the Princess Elizabeth Orthopaedic Hospital in Exeter. The training was 20 months and after qualifying she went to Yeovil District Hospital in 1982, to commence her training as an State Registered Nurse, as it was called back then!

In 1985, Helen was awarded the Sir John English Memorial Shield for Outstanding Nurse of the Year and she started her career as a staff nurse on the orthopaedic wards at Yeovil. Helen moved to Oxford in 1986, to work as a senior staff nurse on a rheumatology ward in an orthopaedic hospital, before leaving the NHS to work in the Sanatorium at Eton College, Windsor, for a year, where she cared for the sons

of some famous people.

In 1989 Helen moved to Allhallows school near Seaton, Devon to run her own school Sanatorium. Many a night was spent looking after boys with rugby injuries, hangovers from illicit parties and multiple health issues. While at Allhallows, Helen met and fell in love with the school Catering Manager, Geoff Every. They married, settled down in Chard and had a son, Harry.

While Harry was young Helen, worked nights in a Nursing Home and locumed as a Practice nurse around Somerset before she was offered a permanent post at Taunton Road Medical Centre in Bridgwater in 1998. During her time in Bridgwater Helen, gained many skills and undertook a lot of training and many courses. In 2008 she achieved a Bachelor of Science, First Class Honours Degree, as a Nurse Practitioner. During her time at Taunton Road MC, she became the Clinical Lead for Nursing. She also arranged training courses, supported practice nurses throughout the Bridgwater Federation and lectured a couple of times at Bournemouth University.

After Geoff retired, Helen was thrilled, following 18 yrs at Taunton Road, to be offered a post as Lead Nurse and Advanced Nurse Practitioner, at the Quantock Medical Centre in Nether Stowey, where she lives.

In 2022 Helen was awarded the Alan Nabarro Medal for having Type 1 diabetes for 50 yrs. Shortly after this, Helen caught Covid and unfortunately while recovering, she had a heart attack. Because of this and other health issues, Helen decided to retire after 42.5yrs as a nurse. She wants to spend more time with Geoff, her family and to enjoy her hobbies, especially travelling!

On a different note we have been very fortunate since my last Messenger Article – we have had amazing offers of support to fund equipment and put on fund raising events over the year, so we have very much to be thankful for and we will update you as things occur. Reaching out for help has been amazing and shown the generosity of the village, I have been really heartened by this.

Alec Page 1923-2023

Alec lived well into his 100th year in his home in Plainsfield, still on his feet, independent, laughing and smiling and enjoying visits from his family and the company of his neighbours and many friends. He led a long and interesting life.

He grew up in the West London pub The Colton Arms that was run by his parents. A keen Boy Scout before the war he and the other Rover Scouts became stretcher bearers during the London Blitz. He used to cycle across London to his first Job in a shipping and insurance company and after work would join the City of London Fire Watch. Turning 18 in 1941 he volunteered for the Royal Navy and was sent to the grandly named HMS Royal Arthur which turned out to be Butlins Skegness where he trained as a Wireless Operator and Telegraphist. He was posted to an Iceland shore station then served on minesweepers operating out of Reykjavik before being called home as a 'volunteer' to the Submarine Service.

The RN had lost a lot of submarines many with their full crew and had run out out of true volunteers. Alec said that he and his companions were more than a little frightened of what their fate might be as they were tested for bad ears and claustrophobia by descending into a water filled silo wearing weights and breathing apparatus. After further training he went back to sea on HMS Sea Scout, a big, newly built S-Class submarine, 200ft long with a crew of 48. Sea Scout patrolled the North Atlantic between Norway and Iceland before sailing to the Far East in 1944 to take part in operations against Japan alongside the US Navy.

At the end of the war she joined a hastily assembled RN Fleet which entered Hong Kong Harbour and took the surrender of the Japanese forces in the colony. Alec went ashore as part of a very small British force and witnessed what he said were terrible conditions among the people of Hong Kong, and some of the reprisals and brutality between the Chinese, those who had collaborated and the remaining Japanese who had been unable to escape. He eventually got home

safely to his wife Doris who he had met and married in a few short months ashore in Blyth and his daughter Denise who he had never seen.

Returning to work in Insurance in the City of London Alec took the opportunity in 1966 to join the start-up brokerage Cooper Gay as one of three directors with three staff. By 1983 they had over 100 staff and Alec decided to retire aged 60 to Somerset with his second wife Jean to keep horses and maybe do some consultancy work. The consultancy work evolved into another successful expansion of a city firm and he became Chairman of Mears & Co before retiring again at the age of 72. He always said he had enjoyed the best years of the City, travelled widely through business and made many friends.

He loved horses and had many memories of happy times riding out with good friends on the hills. He at one time part owned a racehorse with 'mixed' results but bringing him much pleasure if a little bit too much excitement. To the very end of his life he liked to say how lucky he had been and insisted that he only lived so long because he had been a 'wicked old sod.'

Peter Greig 1939-2023

Peter became Chairman of Nether Stowey Parish Council in February 2012. He was particularly involved in driving forward the Quantock Parishes Cluster, worked with Sedgemoor's Affordable Housing team on the Harry Prowse Close project for which he chaired the Council's not always easy public sessions, regularly interrogated the Hinkley C construction team on the need for a dedicated site traffic route (Peter had worked as a very young engineer on the construction of Hunterston Nuclear Power Station in Scotland) and initiated the "virtual pavement" on Lime Street to reduce risk on the school walk.

He helped revive the Playing Field Committee at its nadir, was a signatory to the Licence for the Millennium Wood Jubilee extension, took a keen interest in the re-presentation of Coleridge Cottage -

believing it would have a positive impact on the local economy - and helping chose local C18th apple tree varieties for the renovated garden. Usually a diplomatic Parish Council chairman, on one occasion however, drily introducing the fourth successive recurrence of an agenda item (still sadly a repetitive issue): "And now we get to the main event – dog fouling".

Outside his Council work Peter became chairman of the Somerset Local Action Group responsible for allocating European Regional Development Funds, when he was involved in funding the renovation of the Quantock Lodge swimming pool complex and later with installation of the solar panels on the Church Centre roof. Within the community Peter worked on the Village Hall committee at the time of its amalgamation into a Charitable Incorporated Organisation with the Recreation Ground. He was an active member of our Twinning Association, regularly winning the annual boules competition and exchanging visits with Theillay. He participated rigorously in Nether Stowey's Neighbourhood Plan Working Group at its outset.

Trained as a civil engineer, Peter's career was substantially associated with construction, flood control and hydro-electric projects on The Thames, The Indus, The Tigris, The Nile and The Yangtze-Yalong. However the only body of water he ever fell into was Stowey Brook – twice, eyes and thoughts on the wide horizon. He loved life in Nether Stowey - reveling in oysters from Porlock, a bottle of red, a lunch in the garden, chatting in the village on any and all subjects.

He was a proud Grandfather to four boys – Robin, Jack, Huw, and Peter, able to enjoy their company "without the awful first-hand responsibility of providing for them".

We remember him as a gentle, kind, humorous, generous, hard working husband, father, grandfather and friend. We are missing him dreadfully.

Changing Times for Nether and Over Stowey Parishes

Within the next few months, those visiting the Parish Churches in Nether and Over Stowey will see a document pinned to the door outlining proposed changes to the parish groupings in Quantock Deanery. The PCC, and I, would be very grateful if you could take a moment to consider the proposals once they are published.

In the challenging financial environment it faces post-Covid, the Diocese of Bath and Wells has taken the difficult decision to reduce its number of paid clergy. Every area of Somerset will be affected by these reductions and in our area (Quantock Deanery), we are required to reduce our number of those clergy from 5 to 4.

We have considered very carefully how this could happen whilst ensuring that the church continues to serve our rural communities such as yours, maintain regular worship in our church buildings, and provide pastoral care for those in times of sorrow and joy. There were no easy answers but after a great deal of consideration by representatives from across the Deanery, and consultation with all the church councils, the following proposals are being made.

- Kilve, Holford and Stringston parishes will form a new grouping with the Quantock Villages Benefice and Revd Eleanor King (based in Nether Stowey) will be their new Rector.
- Stogursey and Fiddington parishes will become a new benefice with Cannington, Stockland and Steart, and Otterhampton with Combwich, with Revd Alison Waters (me) as their Rector.
- Revd Nicky Morgan (currently Rector of Quantock Coast Benefice) will move to Bicknoller. She will remain the Rector of East and West Quantoxhead, and will also serve the parishes currently known as Quantock Towers Benefice.
- Watchet and Williton Benefice will remain as it is.

In addition, all the parishes of our Deanery will form a new Group Ministry. This is a means by which we can work much more closely together as clergy and church communities, supporting one another, and especially those invaluable and incredibly hardworking wardens and volunteers who keep our churches open and available to villagers and visitors.

The consultation period, once it begins, will last for six weeks during which all residents are welcome to respond to the proposals. If you would like to know more please do not hesitate to contact a Churchwarden or other member of the PCC and you are welcome also to contact me direct.

Getting to the point of this proposal has been difficult, and we are very aware that it will be painful for some. We are glad, though, to have been given the opportunity to put the plan together ourselves, knowing as we do the needs of our churches and our communities, and we believe that this proposal does offer the best potential for our churches going forward.
