The 215th WOMEN'S WALK - 17th June 2023 at 3pm

The organising of the 215th WOMEN'S WALK is being finalised. All local women and children are welcome to attend.

The historic tradition, of the women of Nether Stowey walking each year, on the Saturday closest to mid-summer, is to honour the memory of Thomas Poole.

Thomas Poole was born in Stowey in 1765. He was a tanner who used his wealth to improve the lives of the poor in the village. In 1806 he started the Nether Stowey Female Friendly Society to help women in times of sickness, childbirth, widowhood and old age.

We have walked now for 215 years. The only break has been the two years of the Covid Pandemic.

Traditionally, everyone dressed up in their Sunday best for the walk, although this is no longer expected. They also carried a posy of flowers to put on Thomas Poole's grave.

The 215th walk will take place on Saturday 17th June.

We will meet at the Cross in the middle of the village at 3pm with the walk to St Mary's Church, headed by bagpipes, starting at 3.15pm. After a short service in the church, and a visit to Thomas Poole's grave we will walk back to the Church Centre for Afternoon Tea.

Further details of registering for this event will be in the next Messenger, but in the meantime please note this date in your diaries.

Quantock U3a Local History Group visit to Nether Stowey 17th April 2023

A group of 14 people from the recently formed Quantock U3a Local History Group visited the village on the afternoon of 17th April for a "walk through time".

The group assembled at The Thomas Poole Library where Roger Stacey gave a detailed introductory talk about the history of the village which dates back over two thousand years. The visitors then divided into two groups which were led by Roger Stacey and Norma Frood, assisted by Sandra Sidaway, Pat Pardoe and Sian Stafford.

The groups progressed from the Library down Castle Street observing its historic pre-Medieval, Medieval and Georgian landmarks, in particular the former Saxon hall house and Poole House, home of Thomas Poole. The groups assembled at the Cross with an overview of the immediate area of the Clock Tower, Clock House and George Inn and site of the old Market Cross, stocks, well and Shambles. Roger read out a very scathing and humorous review from John Taylor (the "Water Poet") of his horrendous overnight stay at the Rose & Crown Inn in 1649.

The visitors then moved on down St Mary Street to the Toll House before returning to Lime Street to view the site of the old Quantock Savings Bank founded by Thomas Poole and the houses and workshops of tradesmen of the past, including the wheelwright's house, the old forge, the saddler and James "Conjuror" Cole the clockmaker.

After viewing Coleridge Cottage (formerly called Gilbards) and the Village Hall, the group returned to the Library via Palmer's Path for refreshments and discussion and viewing of books, maps, old school books (provided by Roger) and photographs.

The visitors remarked how much rich history we have in the village and how they had enjoyed being shown its hidden past.

Gardening with Nick - May 2023

What a mixture of weather so far this year! A very dry February followed by a wet March which in-



cluded snow and now towards mid April a mix of some warm sunshine, some light frosts and now as I write towards mid April more rain and strong winds. No wonder we are always talking about the weather! When there is a risk of frost still protect frost susceptible crops such as new growth on potatoes by earthing them up or covering with fleece.

Vegetables: it is a busy month and small successional sowings of salad crops can be made to give continuity. Transplants of Brussels sprouts, cabbage, kale and cauliflower which were sown last month can be planted out together with leeks. Alternatively, transplants can be purchased from nurseries and garden centres. Frost tender vegetables may be sown directly into the soil once the risk of frost has gone such as runner beans, French beans and sweetcorn. Container sown marrows, courgettes and squashes sown in April can be planted out from late May onwards. Potatoes should be regularly earthed up helping to prevent tubers turning green. The same can be achieved on 'no dig beds' by applying a good dressing of compost. It also provides a chance to remove any weed, especially perennials such as bindweed and thistle, etc.

Ornamentals: it has been a good spring for the early flowering shrubs such as Ribes (flowering currants), Forsythia and Berberis darwini Following flowering they respond well to having some of the older wood removed and this stimulates strong new growth for carrying flower the following year. Remember that bedding plants being used for baskets, tubs and hanging baskets do need hardening off before being placed in their final positions. Incorporating water storage granules into the compost will help water retention.

If your established daffodils did not flower well this spring it may be

that the bulbs are too congested. Once the foliage starts to yellow it is a good time to lift clumps and split into smaller clumps and replant. Many herbaceous perennials will require some form of support and if supports such as strong twiggy growth are put in early it allows foliage to grow up through the support and be largely hidden from view.

The greenhouse: it is planting time for tomatoes, peppers, aubergines and cucumbers whether it be in the soil or grow bags and regular watering and feeding should take place. Try to give as much ventilation in the day as possible to prevent excessive temperatures. Shading the house with netting or whitewash may be beneficial as can leaving the door open on hot days.

Fruit: strawberries will be developing trusses of green fruits. Place strawberry mats or straw around the plants which will help to prevent soil splash and ensure that plants are protected from birds with netting. As the fruits of strawberries, raspberries, tayberries, currants and gooseberries start to swell ensure that plants have sufficient water. Plum moth can be an unwelcome pest resulting in the maggot within the fruit. Non chemical control can be provided using pheromone traps available from garden centres and on line. May is the optimum period to place the traps within the tree.

Lawns: For those that like a pristine lawn this is a good month to feed it and treat it for weeds such as daisy, dandelion and buttercup. Sparse areas can be oversown with a suitable seed mixture. An alternative is to take a more relaxed attitude and allow the grass to grow longer and let the weeds (wild flowers) grow up within the grass. This is good for wildlife and paths can be mown through at normal height of cut to introduce an informal design.

Dates for your Diary

July 15th -16th Big Bash cricket weekend in conjunction with Over Stowey Cricket club

Since last writing in the March issue of the Messenger, Stowey Green Spaces Group has been busy. Stowey green spaces

In late February there was a very effective clearing of brambles in the A39 Bypass Wood to keep previously cleared areas under control. The next week was a very

different task, to repair the steps in Butcher's Lane leading to Castle Mount; one of the step risers had rotted and general improvement and replacement was needed all round. In March, emphasis shifted to Millennium Wood where, earlier, thinning of the trees had been carried out by apprentices and their supervisors from the Quantock Landscape Partnership scheme. A work party spent a pleasant afternoon stacking the 2 metre length trunks from the thinning into small heaps for later collection and possible sale as firewood, and collecting the brash (small branches and twigs) into "Habitat Piles". These piles rot down slowly but provide a useful and safe environment for small mammals and many varieties of insects even though they are a nuisance as they also encourage yet more brambles to grow! At the end of the month attention returned to Platinum Wood where a group from Taunton Midweek Conservation Volunteers did sterling work removing the length of fence between the Diamond and Platinum Jubilee Woods, including cutting a gap in the hedge making easier access between the two. Then, using reclaimed posts, the upper length of fence between Platinum Jubilee Wood and Stowey Rocks farm was repaired, replacing three of the original posts that had been broken by falling trees. At the same time the tree guards collected from Stowey Wood were put back to good use by Green Spaces members so that nearly all the Platinum Wood trees now have guards. To complete a successful day some partially buried tyres from the old silage pit were uncovered and added to the existing heap.

In early April the snowdrops were over in Millennium Wood but daffodils, primroses and a carpet of celandines made a magnificent display. There was also a good display of primroses along the cemetery wall leading to the Recreation Ground Memorial Gate, particularly pleasing as these were only planted last autumn. By early May primroses will mostly be over, but there should be a few bluebells and possibly some wood anemones in Millennium Wood, and apple blossom along the top boundary fence. There should also be a good display of bluebells and wood anemones in Stowey Wood. Do, please, take a walk and see for yourselves.

News from The Quantock Medical Centre

We have been absolutely amazed by the generosity of the local villages and are so thankful for the generous donations we have had after my last newsletter. The response has been amazing and so heart-warming. Mervyn & Margaret 'Books for Life; Charity have donated the whole cost of the doppler machine £3500, we have had it delivered and now just need to train the team in the next few weeks to use it, I have already seen it demonstrated on Nurse Rose and it will make such a difference to us in terms care to our patients and time saved in diagnosis.

I also attended the Nether Stowey Parish Council meeting who have also generously donated £1500 towards the costs and maintenance of the village defibrillator on the outside wall of the Practice. When you call an ambulance, they will usually ask if you have a defib nearby and to go and get it prior to the ambulance arriving. I will look to replace the box it sits in this year as it is quite damaged and needs a good tug to get it open. When the box is open it gives out a very loud alarm which only stops when it is closed again – so if you need it, please don't be afraid of the noise and to be forceful when getting it out!

We have also received a generous sum of £500 from the Stogursey Community Network which has gone towards Digital scales and we will be funding a more portable fast ECG machine.

St Marys Nether Stowey Church have agreed to put on a coffee and cake fund raiser on Saturday 10th June, and we have also had some donations form patients. We really do appreciate your kind support, and this all helps towards better care for patients in our community.

Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C



Final phase of Hinkley Point C's offshore work begins

Two floating heavy lift platforms have arrived into the Bristol Channel, as the offshore work moves into its final stage.

The vessels, named "Neptune" and "Sea Challenger", will be used to link the existing tunnels with the intake heads on the seabed. The link will allow seawater to flow through the power station's cooling water system.

Six vertical shafts will be installed at depth of more than 20-metres – and will connect the six miles of tunnels and the intake and outtake heads. These 5,000-tonne structures were lowered onto the seabed last summer and will circulate water to the two nuclear reactors.

The platforms' cranes have a combined lifting capacity of 1,500 tonnes At 132m, the "Sea Challenger" is longer than a football pitch, and "Neptune" is 60m long.



HPC visits local schools for British Science Week

The Visits Team attended various Somerset schools as part of British Science Week. This was a 10-day celebration of science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) organised by the British Science Association and was a great opportunity to inform and inspire the next generation.

Over the course of two weeks, the team delivered interactive workshops and assemblies, suitable for the audience at each school.

Pupils were invited to consider what we use electricity for and how we can make it. James Mansfield, Education Specialist, Hinkley Point Visits Team, outlined the fundamental physics, chemistry and biology that helps us to make electricity safely via a nuclear reactor.

Students were thrilled as the project's Education Specialist, James recited almost the entire periodic table in under 90 seconds; presenting to them some of the challenges that our chemists have on site.

Big Lift Success

April started with one of the largest and most challenging lifts seen so far. Big Carl successfully lifted the Reactor Cavity and Core Internal Storage Pool, which was in excess of 700 tonnes.

Lying at the heart of our Reactor Building, the Reactor Cavity and Core Internal Storage Pool provides a tank of water that completely covers the Reactor during refuelling and maintenance. This means it can be safely opened when needed, with the water providing a vital layer of shielding to our operatives as they handle nuclear fuel assemblies and other internal components.

Changing Times for Nether and Over Stowey Parishes

Within the next few months, those visiting the Parish Churches in Nether and Over Stowey will see a document pinned to the door outlining proposed changes to the parish groupings in Quantock Deanery. The PCC, and I, would be very grateful if you could take a moment to consider the proposals once they are published.

In the challenging financial environment it faces post-Covid, the Diocese of Bath and Wells has taken the difficult decision to reduce its number of paid clergy. Every area of Somerset will be affected by these reductions and in our area (Quantock Deanery), we are required to reduce our number of those clergy from 5 to 4.

We have considered very carefully how this could happen whilst ensuring that the church continues to serve our rural communities such as yours, maintain regular worship in our church buildings, and provide pastoral care for those in times of sorrow and joy. There were no easy answers but after a great deal of consideration by representatives from across the Deanery, and consultation with all the church councils, the following proposals are being made.

Kilve, Holford and Stringston parishes will form a new grouping with the Quantock Villages Benefice and Revd Eleanor King (based in Nether Stowey) will be their new Rector. Stogursey and Fiddington parishes will become a new benefice with Cannington, Stockland and Steart, and Otterhampton with Combwich, with Revd Alison Waters (me) as their Rector. Revd Nicky Morgan (currently Rector of Quantock Coast Benefice) will move to Bicknoller. She will remain the Rector of East and West Quantoxhead, and will also serve the parishes currently known as Quantock Towers Benefice.

Watchet and Williton Benefice will remain as it is.

In addition, all the parishes of our Deanery will form a new Group Ministry. This is a means by which we can work much more closely together as clergy and church communities, supporting one another, and especially those invaluable and incredibly hardworking wardens and volunteers who keep our churches open and available to villagers and visitors.

The consultation period, once it begins, will last for six weeks during which all residents are welcome to respond to the proposals. If you would like to know more please do not hesitate to contact a Churchwarden or other member of the PCC and you are welcome also to contact me direct.

Getting to the point of this proposal has been difficult, and we are very aware that it will be painful for some. We are glad, though, to have been given the opportunity to put the plan together ourselves, knowing as we do the needs of our churches and our communities, and we believe that this proposal does offer the best potential for our churches going forward.
