We've just started the fourth year of the five-year National Lottery Heritage Fund-supported Quantock Landscape Partnership



Scheme. Time flies, so as the project end in March 2025 looms it concentrates our minds on things not yet done! At the same time our independent evaluator has given us a glowing mid-project report, which is very encouraging. She has recommended that from now on we really focus on fully embedding our very successful inclusive engagement work within our host Quantock Hills AONB.

Our Apprenticeship scheme has been running since last October and our three apprentices have been out thinning plantations, laying and surveying hedges, planting and weeding new saplings, undertaking small construction jobs, and generally gaining experiences and qualifications in a range of practical countryside skills. Please get in touch if you have any small jobs that would be good experience for the trainees – no promises but we'll see what we can do. They come with a supervisor.

We still have grants available (up to 75% of the cash costs) for hedgerow planting and restoration, creation and management of traditional orchards, and repair of historic structures including traditional white road sign fingerposts. We also have grants for the creation of small wildflower meadows, but these would have to be started this autumn so if you're interested get in touch asap. Our grants are open to Parish Councils, community organisations and individuals.

Our illustrated talk by Nigel Phillips on 8th June was a fascinating eye-opener to the wealth of wildlife along our wonderful Somerset coastline, from Minehead to Portishead. Who would have expected to see a pod of dolphins in Blue Anchor bay, just opposite the Driftwood Cafe? Or knew that there is a forest of sea kelp off Porlock Weir? With some brilliant photographs

Nigel showed us just how many rare and unusual plants grow along the shore and on the cliffs. Our varied coastline also provides many different habitats for plants and butterflies. The reserves at Steart and Berrow are breeding grounds for avocets and dunlin in particular, and his pictures of a flock of avocets in flight were amazing. He does underwater photography too, and some of his shots taken whilst snorkelling revealed some beautiful starfish and sea anemones, only to be seen when the tide is in.

Our speaker at our next meeting on 13th July will be a Street Pastor, and it should prove interesting to find out how they operate and about the wonderful work they do.

The Quantock Hills Walking Festival 7th – 11th June 2023



Another successful event took place last week for local Walkers are Welcome group Stowey Walking. This year was their fifth walking festival showcasing the beautiful walks available on the Quantock Hills and West Somerset coast. Seven guided walks took place over five days with themes such as local history, archaeology, and wildlife. Over fifty walkers took part from all over Somerset and further afield. Ten participants also took part in a four-day challenge walk taking in the fifty-one miles of the Coleridge Way from Nether Stowey to Lynmouth.

Stowey Walking would like to thank all the walk leaders and everyone who helped to make the event a success. With especial thanks to this year's the main sponsors the Quantock Landscape Partnership Scheme who provided funding and expertise and Somerset Passenger Solutions at EDF who provided transport to and from some of the walk locations. 'We hope everyone enjoyed themselves and that we will see you all again next year.'



The first task in May for **Stowey Green Spaces Group** was to cut the exuberant growth around the newly planted trees in Platinum Wood to help give them a good start. It was pleasing to

see that most of the saplings had taken and showed quite a lot of leaf growth. The upper path in Stowey Wood is well used and this too needed some cutting back to keep a few stray branches, brambles, wild raspberry and nettles under control. In early July it is hoped to do the same at the western end of the exit path from the Stowey Wood.

The second task was very different when a large group of members started work on the footpath in Millennium Wood to try to make it possible to complete an internal circuit of the wood on a mobility scooter. Modern scooters are surprisingly roadworthy but can be defeated by steep slopes, sudden changes in terrain and large tree roots. An extensive stretch of path was improved on the eastern side of the wood by cutting out roots, putting in edging using the tree trunks cut earlier, and filling in dips with soil taken from a large heap in New Stowey Farm and transported to the site in wheel barrows. This leaves two small stretches of path to be worked on and then, a Test Drive!

Finally, the Group has hosted Duke of Edinburgh students before and it was very pleasing to have one of our members working with and supervising his grandson on a DoE task, cutting brambles near the Recreation ground entrance. An impressive amount was achieved in just two hours.

The Nether Stowey Flower Show has been a fixture of the village calendar for many, many years, taking place on the 3rd Saturday in August.

Categories include vegetables, flowers, flower

arrangements, cooking, crafts and photography. There is a children's section too. It is a whole family event and in the past 5 generations of one family have entered.

Hinkley Point C - Monthly Update A round up of the latest news from Hinkley Point C



Sir Keir Starmer visits Hinkley Point C

Hinkley Point C welcomed the Leader of the Labour Party, Sir Keir Starmer MP. Sir Keir met with apprentices, union representatives and hosted a question and answer session with 50 members of our workforce. He emphasised the need for more new nuclear in Britain and the crucial role of its reliable, low-carbon electricity for fighting climate change and increasing energy security.

Mental Health Awareness Week was a great success! Hinkley Point C shone a spotlight on mental wellbeing by enabling colleagues to openly share stories of their personal struggles. In turn, valuable resources were promoted to help achieve better mental health for all.

Mental Health Buddies are ready on site to support our workforce by being available to listen and extend a helping hand when people feel down or overwhelmed. The growing team of volunteers recently attended the first HPC Mental Health conference to celebrate the success of the industry leading initiative but to also provide ongoing training.

First switchboards installed in Electrical Building

The first of a set of 10kV switchboards that will help distribute electricity across Hinkley Point C during operation has been installed. They are the first pieces of electrical equipment installed in the power station.

The switchboards are used to connect and disconnect parts of the power system so it can be operated safely without being overloaded or interrupting overall supply. The journey to install the switchboards has taken six years to ensure they meet stringent nuclear-safety standards.

Over Stowey Parish Council



The Parish Council held their annual meetings in May and the Annual Parish Meeting was a chance to review the achievements over the past year. There was also an interesting and informative report from the Stowey Green Spaces Group on all the work they undertake for both Over Stowey and Nether Stowey. Please see a copy of the report on the website.

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council started with the reelection of Cllr Tully as the Chair and Cllr Barrow as the Vice-Chair. Representatives for other groups and services were also agreed.

The <u>Annual Governance and Accountability Return</u> was fully reviewed and the Internal Audit has been completed with no issues reported. This can be viewed on the website.

At the previous meeting it had been requested by the Over Stowey Village Hall and Recreation Ground Committee that if the event held by them needed top up funding, would the Parish Council consider this. As it turned out the event was successful and additional funds were not required. However, the committee are looking into where the village hall could benefit from being updated. Plans are being considered and costs looked into, so there may be a donation request from them at some point in the near future.

The Highways department have provided further updates on the requests for the parish. Drainage work will take place in Aley at some point over the summer. Other maintenance work on the drains and gullies within the parish will take place sometime during the financial year. Work on signage and road markings will be undertaken and it is hoped some of this will have happened by the time that this issue of the Quantock Messenger was published.

Nick's Gardening Notes July and August 2023



So far we have had no rain in June following a relatively dry May and most gardener's water butts will be empty by now. This has resulted in some poor germination, plants slow to establish and many plants showing stress. Water should not be wasted and priority should be given to helping plants/crops to establish and those crops that will really benefit from water such as courgettes and squashes and those that respond to extra water at moisture sensitive stages. Peas and beans benefit from water at the flowering and pod swelling stage and potatoes when the new tubers are at the marble stage. Weeds competing for moisture and nutrients should be controlled particularly the deep rooted perennials such as dandelion, creeping thistle and bindweed. When watering it is important to give plants a good drink rather than just a splash which quickly dries out and encourages shallow rooting.

Vegetables: July weather can often be warm and damp and a watchful eye should be kept on potatoes and outdoor tomatoes for any sign of potato blight. Foliage affected with brown/black markings should be removed and burnt and not put onto the compost heap. There are currently no recommended chemical sprays for the home gardener.

Carrots, lettuce, spring cabbage, turnips, and oriental leaves together with mangetout peas can still be sown and early July is a good time to sow Florence fennel. Ensure that brassicas (e.g. cabbage, kale, cauliflower, sprouts etc.) already planted are protected from cabbage white butterfly by using small mesh netting (5-7 mm) supported **above** the crop and not resting on the foliage.

Fruit: once strawberries have finished fruiting it is an opportunity to rejuvenate the crop. Old straw should be raked out and composted and the foliage cut down to about 50 -75 mm (2 to 3 inches) and any weed removed. Apply a liquid feed or general fertiliser and water in and in no time quality new foliage will appear. This all helps to remove pests and diseases and unwanted runners should also be removed. Interestingly, next year's flowers are initiated within the plant in the autumn. After four or five years strawberry yields do start to deteriorate and it is sensible to establish a new planting on a fresh piece of ground. Once fruiting has finished main crop raspberry canes can be cut down to ground level leaving the new canes which can be tied in.

New growth on cordon and espalier apples and pears should be summer pruned to restrict size and encourage the build-up of fruit bud for the following year. This can also apply to wall trained shrubs such as Pyracantha and Chaenomeles (Japonica or Japanese quince).


Ornamentals: ensure that new growth on climbing and rambling roses is tied in to avoid being damaged by wind. Wisteria has made strong new growth and should be pruned in August. The new whippy growth is cut back to a bud about 150mm (6 inches) from the base to encourage the build-up of flower bud for the following year.

It is important to regularly deadhead blooms for continuity of flower and with some such as lupins, poppies and delphiniums they can be cut back hard down to the basal cluster of leaves to produce new growth and some late flower. Bearded iris have been good this year and following flowering can be lifted and old rhizomes cut out and young vibrant sections replanted being careful not to bury the rhizomes and with their foliage cut down by half. Apply a general fertiliser dressing or mulch and water well in to ensure good growth and bloom next year.

Propagation: in August (mid summer) it is timely to take semi ripe cuttings of many shrubs such as berberis, weigela, deutzia, lavendula and rosmarinus.

Wild because we will celebrate creation and hear from a speaker from A Rocha, a Christian charity concerned for our environment. A very warm welcome from us here at Coleridge Cottage!

The garden is full of wild flowers, the roses are in bloom, and the blackbirds sound jubilant! And it has been lovely meeting more and more local folk. Residence passes seem to be a success this year and we'd like to remind you that, for £10, your card entitles you and a friend to free entry all year, plus **10% off** at the tearoom.

Coleridge Cottage hosted a Poetry reading by prize-winning poet, Graeme Ryan on 22nd June 2023 in the garden.

'The Dreaming of Hinkley Point' imagines Coleridge, Dorothy and William Wordsworth in the 21st century landscape of the Somerset coast and the Quantocks, a place where natural magic meets cutting edge technology, where light and seemingly divine nuclear power come on at a switch and 'the shining city on a plain' evokes Kubla Khan: an irresistible beacon to these poets and their entourage.

Heading through the timeless combes and woods, past the oak-leafed setting of Alfoxton, over upland heaths and the nuclear A, B, C of the Bristol Channel – and into the mind and laudanum trances of Coleridge - *The Dreaming of Hinkley Point* is a powerful, tender, deeply imagined and thought-provoking work.

Graeme Ryan is a prize-winning poet who lives in West Somerset. He has performed widely in the South West. His collection *Valley of the Kings* came out in 2022.

We've kept it as a small orchard and wild flower meadow, with daisies taller than toddlers. We have benches hidden away, and the lime tree bower at the end. It is a beautiful place to come for some tranquillity, quiet and creative reflection.

We'd love to see you, for tea and cake, during your little escape from 21st century life.
