The foundations are truly in place of a great school! During our OFSTED inspection March 2023 inspectors noted that Nether Stowey is a happy, safe and welcoming school.

They live by the school's ethos of 'We are caring, we are active, we are our best.' Pupils behave well in class and at social times. …they are inquisitive and engaged. Leaders are ambitious for the school. Leaders have established a well-sequenced curriculum.

I would like to share with you some of our academic success this year. This data will be published in the autumn term so far from published results. Our year 1 phonic screen above national average. Our KS1 attainment data for children achieving the expected standard in reading, writing and maths is above national average. The year 4 multiplication check above the national average.

We have an amazing choir that have carried out serval performance including 'The women's' walk. The children have sung and raised funds for their own choir t-shirts.

Nether Stowey is a community school and I would like to say a huge congratulations to FONNS who raised a staggering £3138 pounds during the school summer fair held at Nether Stowey Park. This money will go towards, all children having a pantomime visit, equipment for the playground and art and DT equipment including equipment for forest school.

The phrase "it takes a village to raise a child" originates from an African proverb and conveys the message that it takes many people ("the village") to provide a safe, healthy environment for children,

where children are given the security they need to develop and flourish, and to be able to realize their hopes and dreams.

The Speaker for our 13th July meeting was unfortunately unable to come due to illness. Instead, at short notice, we had a visit from Jaci Elliott, who is the Area Coordinator for Project



Linus UK. Project Linus make and supply quilts and blankets to youngsters from new-born babies to teenagers either in hospitals, hospices, foster-care, refuges or anywhere where a comforting "hug" is needed.

This 100% volunteer non-profit Community Interest initiative was started in America in 1995 when Karen Loucks saw a newspaper article saying how much a comfort blanket had helped a child cancer victim. She started by organising blankets and guilts for her local children's cancer unit, and since then millions have been delivered worldwide. Project Linus UK began in March 2000 when a group of Birmingham guilters wanted to put their skills to helping children in need. There are guide-lines as to what the article should be made of, for example, machine-washable material, what sizes and not have any buttons or ribbons which could be caught by tiny fingers or swallowed. The Project also makes "memory bags" to go with the premature babies' blanket for the parents to keep. The sick child gets to keep the comfort blanket or guilt. Project Linus always welcomes people who can quilt, knit or crochet and they supply patterns for the blankets, quilts and memory bags. #### **COFFEE AND CAKE**

Everyone is very welcome to the monthly Coffee & Cake morning at the Church Centre . The next one will be on Saturday September 9th 10.30-12.00.



Stowey Green Spaces Group has had a busy summer improving footpaths and keeping plant growth under control with an average of 9 volunteers turning out for each task from a pool of about 15, first in the blazing heat and then in the chilly wet. Work had started in June on making the circular footpath in Millennium

Wood passable for mobility scooters and this was completed in July and a successful test drive carried out. It must be emphasised, though, that it would always be best to be accompanied or to carry a mobile when on this route as it does need care.

Also in June a lot of bramble and gorse had been cleared from the actual Mount of Castle Mount and this work was continued in July by a party from Taunton Midweek Conservation Volunteers plus some Green Spaces workers, and the bracken more or less cleared from the Mount and reasonably under control in the rest of the site. Unfortunately this is not so true for gorse which is coming back quite strongly in places, and advice is needed on how best to control it. At this time of the year, as gardeners know only too well, plants grow wild filling gardens with weeds and making footpaths difficult and sometimes painful to walk through. A work party did a good job clearing the upper path in Stowey Wood, and the exit path from the wood and in the fields leading towards New Stowey farm. This is a popular circular walk and the group does try to keep it accessible but nature can be very determined! The final task at time of writing, was to clear along Stowey Brook from outside the Fire Station through to where the conduit goes under the A39. Some of this work had been done last year but had to stop because of the angry occupants of a wasp's nest. Fortunately there were no wasps this year and the stream was cleared and the hedge cut to be clear of the water and to allow safe walking along the pavement (see photo). Litter picking continues every 3rd. Saturday of the month and is a

Litter picking continues every 3rd. Saturday of the month and is a popular activity with some 20 people walking the streets and paths with their blue bags and litter picker sticks.

#### STOWEY WOOD: BRAMBLE CLEARANCE INVITATION

Each autumn Stowey Green Spaces volunteers need to control bramble to prevent it from choking the young saplings planted in Stowey Wood. This year we plan a community day from 10.30 – 15.30 on Sunday 17 September. We would be delighted if you could join us. Just come along at whatever time suits you and spend as much or as little time with us as you can spare. You'll need long trousers, sturdy boots (or wellies), gloves, secateurs and or loppers. The more of us the merrier - and the shorter the time it will take to do the job. The good news is that this should be the last year for bramble clearance. Most of the trees are doing well. By the next growing season they should be sufficiently established to fend for themselves and hopefully start to shade out the bramble. #### **Notes from the Quantock Medical Centre**

WOW – we came 1st in the Somerset Patient Survey 2023 and 10th in the country so we would like to thank all our patients that completed and returned those questionnaires they received.

Of course there are no real prizes for this kind of thing – but it was very heartening for the Practice team to receive this feedback and know that we are doing the right things, and that we are appreciated.

99% Patients said their overall experience of the surgery is good 97% said their GP treated then with care and concern 95% said their GP listened to them

96 % were satisfied with their appointment days and times offered

97% felt they had a good experience the last time they made an appointment

97% think the receptionist are helpful

Thank you for your kind comments we really do appreciate them.

I would also like to remind patients to support their Practice by booking their Flu immunization with their GP Practice rather than anywhere else.

Each year Practices have to order their Flu Immunizations a whole year in advance. Whilst we hope we can predict numbers, we can never predict what changes the NHS are going to make to the Flu Campaign until the last minute!. This year they have moved the goal posts by not allowing healthy 50 – 65 year olds to book in for an NHS Flu jab (as was allowed in previous years), and also insisting that Flu and Covid should be administered at the same time, whilst not allowing individual rural practices to participate in

this scheme unless they join a Hub and administer both vaccines together (from for example Bridgwater). So whilst this has all been a bit frustrating and confusing for us let alone the patients please do come and and support your local practice and book in for a Flu immunization at your Surgery.

# Nick's Gardening Notes September 2023

Looking back on previous September articles I have often commented upon the garden in the summer months and the word 'challenging' regularly occurs! This year a dry June followed by a wet July with some strong winds and an August of rather mixed weather can certainly be described as a challenge for gardeners to contend with. With warm soil and moisture the garden and allotment has grown well but so have the weeds! Many have made very fast growth and run up to flower and setting seed. One seasons seed, seven years weeds may be true and keeping on top of weeds is so important as they compete for nutrients, water and light resulting in poorer quality and quantity of flowers, fruit and vegetables.

Vegetables: Spring cabbage should be planted out and sowings of a winter variety of lettuce such as Winter Density can be sown and covered with a cloche. Autumn onion sets can be planted towards the end of the month such as Radar and Swift. Green outdoor tomatoes can be encouraged to ripen by untying from the cane, stripping off most of the foliage and laying down on straw or polythene and placing a cloche over them. Continue to protect cabbages, kales and sprouts from cabbage white caterpillars with fine mesh netting held above the plants. The finer the netting the better as it will help keep

off white fly from the underside of the leaves. Look out for blight on tomato and potato foliage which should be removed and burnt.

Ornamentals: This month is when the flower border often starts to appear jaded. How can we extend the colour well into the autumn until the first frosts? There are some excellent old faithfuls such as Michaelmas daisies, goldenrod and sedums however there are many others which can not only contribute colour but also texture and form into the border. Consider Liriope muscari (Lilyturf), Actaea matsumurae previously known as cimicifuga (Bugbane), Liatris spinosa (Gayfeather) and some of the late flowering red hot pokers which are not always red and can be very graceful within the border. It is the month when many of the grasses come into their own such as Miscanthus sinensis, Stipa tenuissima and Pennisetum villosum. Against the wall Clematis tangutica and Clematis 'Bill MacKenzie' will give a glorious display of yellow lantern like flowers followed by big fluffy seed heads. Towards the end of the month plant bulbs such as daffodils, Scilla, crocus and hyacinths in borders and containers ready for spring colour.

Fruit: Apples will start to be picked this month and should be handled with care to minimise bruising of any sort. Ensure that the stalk comes away cleanly from the tree and does not include the small piece of growth it is attached to which will have next years fruit bud attached to it! Fruit that is to be stored should be handled gently and individual fruits wrapped in paper to avoid them touching each other. They can then be stored in cool conditions in the dark. Alternatively storing small quantities in polythene bags with a few holes made in them can be successful. Strawberries can be cleaned up cutting back the old foliage and unwanted runners and removing old straw which can harbour pests and diseases. The old canes of summer raspberries, tay berries and loganberries can be cut out.

Propagation: cuttings of tender perennials should be taken in case plants do not survive the increasingly wet winters. Subjects such as

Penstemons, Salvias, Pelargonium, Osteospermums and Fuchsias can all be readily propagated. To aid rooting avoid flowering shoots or if difficult to find pinch the flower bud out.

Other jobs: Evergreen shrubs can be lifted and moved whilst the soil is warm and it is an ideal month for establishing grass from seed.

#### **Conveyancing Conundrums**

veyancing matters! Some of you may remember that I edited the Quantock Messenger for a few years, before leaving to join Amicus Law in Residential Conveyancing ··· clearly the pull of the Messenger was too strong for me to stay away from it for too long.

What is conveyancing? Conveyancing is the legal transfer of property or land from one owner to another.

What is a conveyancer? A Conveyancer is someone who can help you through the process of selling, buying or mortgaging a property. Who needs a conveyancer? It is recommended that sellers and purchasers appoint a conveyancer to deal with their matter, they can provide expert legal advice regarding a range of property related services.

This column is, of course, no substitute for obtaining legal advice and can only give generic advice that may be of use and interest to a number of readers.

Starting us off this month: What does "registered land" and "unregistered land" mean?

HM Land Registry was set up in 1862 to record the ownership of land and any interests affecting the land (such as a mortgage). Until then, buyers and sellers had to rely on physical title deeds and mortgage deeds to prove that the person selling a piece of land had the right to do so and this, of course, could lead to all sorts of complications if deeds were lost or not disclosed.


Registration was initially voluntary, but by 1990 it was made compulsory for any piece of land sold (or mortgaged) in England or Wales to be registered with HMLR. Currently around 88% of the land mass of England and Wales is registered with HMLR, so there are still a significant number of properties that are unregistered. Within our local villages there are a lot of unregistered properties, as many houses have been owned by the same individuals for decades.

If you own a property that is unregistered, it is worth considering getting it registered now as the process can take up to 1 year to complete. If you then decide that you want to sell, it will make the sale process much quicker if it is already registered. Also, for those who will inherit the property, it will make the process much easier for them if they don't need to hunt for title deeds as part of a probate sale. You can check on gov.uk to see if your property is registered or not.






