Security Alert mobile phone returns scam

We have been alerted to reports of a Return Fraud Scam where calls are received from people claiming to be O2 or other mobile phone companies.

A fraudster calls the victim offering a good deal on an upgrade for a mobile phone and manages to obtain personal details to allow them to log into the customers mobile account. The fraudster orders a new phone or product in the customer's name (this will be different to the product the customer thinks they have ordered).

When the new phone is delivered, the customer receives a call to check everything is ok or to activate the device. When it is discovered, the wrong item was sent, the customer is tricked into sending the phone back to what they believe to be O2, in exchange for their correct order.

The fraudster arranges the return and either sends the customer a QR code to visit the Post Office to print the labels or arranges a doorstep collection, where Royal Mail brings the label already printed meaning the victim has no idea of the address the item is going to.

To assist in protecting your customers, please:

- Look out for returns labels stating O2 or other mobile phone companies with a residential address.
- Advise that unexpected calls should always be treated with caution, especially if the caller is offering you a discount, prize or anything else that sounds too good to be true. Advise them to always call the company on a trusted number to verify the information before proceeding.

Opening talk at the Library - Stowey Green Spaces Group

On 13th September Roy Osborne, Chairman of Stowey Green Spaces Group, gave the first of the new season of talks in The Thomas Poole Library. With the new Green Spaces banner by his side, Roy talked us through the history of the Group, its recent work and what it hopes to achieve in the future.

A week before his talk to us he had given a 15 minute presentation on the work of SGSG at the invitation of The Somerset Climate Team, along with the Woodland Trust, Green Ilminster and Re-imaging the Levels. This demonstrates the high profile of our Group in the county and the esteem in which it is held.

The group manages Stowey Wood, Millennium Wood, Diamond Jubilee Wood, Platinum Wood and its extension in the filled-in quarry.

The age of Stowey Wood is unknown but it is clearly ancient and dates to at least 1700. In 1970 the Forestry Commission cleared two thirds of it and planted Sitka Spruce, about half of which was felled from 2014 by forestry students from Bridgwater College. In 2018 the then Somerset County Council licensed the Wood to Stowey Green Spaces Group.

Further Sitka was removed from the difficult terrain by horse logging in 2021 with the help of funding from the Quantock Hills AONB. Children from Nether Stowey School were able to visit during this work and witness the horses in action. The felled timber has provided significant income for the Group and native broadleaf species have been used to replant whole areas. What were saplings only a few years ago are already two metres or more tall.

The Group is assisted in its work by other organisations including Taunton Midweek Conservation Volunteers, the Field Studies Council at Nettlecombe Court (D of E) and the AONB Countryside Volunteers.

New signs have been designed for the Woods and the Mount by Terry Sacket and erected with the help of a grant from the Quantock Landscape Partnership.

In addition to the work in the woods, SGSG is busy in other parts of the Parish. It has been active on the Mount in recent years, cutting back fern and gorse. This has been so successful that the Mount has been removed from English Heritage's 'at danger' list and wild flowers are much more in evidence.

The land adjacent to the A39 byepass has seen clearance of

brambles, sowing of wildflowers and planting and conservation of more trees. Litter picking is carried out around the village on a regular basis and Plot 173 has received attention. Nigel Phillips leads informative walks through the woods.

The future of the county owned New Stowey Farm land is the subject of debate at the moment. A number of organisations, including Somerset Council itself, have made proposals and it seems the Council understands the importance of retaining control of the land for wildlife related purposes. Whatever the outcome, Stowey Green Spaces Group continues to make a difference to our surroundings and would welcome help from even more volunteers.



The September meeting focused mainly on the financial issues affecting Somerset Council as reported at various meetings and also in the press. It is clear that any projects/concerns that the Parish Council might have planned that are not a statutory obligation from the local authority are unlikely to be undertaken due to lack of funding.

Therefore, the Parish Council will be concentrating on what they can do at a local level for the community. If any statutory obligations need to be carried out by Somerset Council, the Parish Council will continue to follow these up to ensure work is carried out as soon as possible.

With regards to problems on the roads, these can be reported online at the Somerset Council web page Report A Problem on the Road or at Fix My Street The second Local Community Network meeting took place on Wednesday 13th September in Spaxton. It was not as well attended as the first one and Cllr Caswell emphasised that these meetings are open to all and anyone wishing to attend would be very welcome. It is an opportunity for local Parish Councils and residents to engage with officers from Somerset Council and to put forward any concerns they wish to be addressed, or requests that may benefit a particular parish or indeed, the LCN area as a whole. As requested previously, as the bird nesting season has ended the Parish Council ask that all landowners in the parish that have a boundary that abuts the highway, cut back hedging and trees as soon as possible to ensure the roads are safe for all road users. If you have any queries, please contact the Clerk. For further information please use the following link Grass cutting (somerset.gov.uk) and scroll down to the section Hedges and Banks. Many thanks to those who have already undertaken this work on their boundary.

Carols on the Cross

St Mary's Church is holding the usual Carols on the Cross on Sunday the 24th of December. We would invite people to come along and celebrate the Nativity. Exciting Progress in the Tunnels

The Marine Team has achieved a major milestone in their tunnelling efforts having successfully excavated their way to the first vertical Liner, a crucial component connecting the heads sitting on the seabed with the tunnel below. This achievement was made possible using advanced technology, specifically a remote guidance system, ensuring precise excavation towards the access hatch of the Liner.

Following this achievement, the team has prepared the Liner for the next steps. They have drained the water, used to weigh down the Liner, and are now ready to conduct detailed surveys and geological studies.

Simultaneously, the team is hard at work connecting the Outfall Tunnel to the second vertical Liner, marking ongoing progress.



Celebrating six years of positive impact





Gardening with Nick

November 2023

Hardwood cuttings: it is an excellent month for taking cuttings of black and redcurrants,

gooseberries and shrubs such as coloured stem dogwoods, willow, forsythia, flowering currants, roses and buddleja. The cutting is normally 200mm to 300mm long and taken from healthy growth produced in 2023 and must be sufficiently substantial to survive the winter outside, aim for 'pencil' thickness. Make a sloping cut just above a bud and a straight basal cut below a bud. Treat with hormone rooting powder (optional) and making a slit with a spade insert the cuttings into the soil to two thirds their length. If your soil is prone to poor drainage place some grit beneath the cutting. Alternatively, the correct conditions can be produced in a deep container using multi-purpose potting compost and placed outside in a sheltered position and ensuring that they do not dry out. Roots will be produced during the 2024 growing season. Cuttings taken last autumn should now be well rooted and they can be lifted and planted out in a permanent position or potted up and given to friends. All very satisfying!

Ornamentals: Autumn and winter winds can disturb the base of taller bush roses and reducing them in height prior to their main pruning in late February will help prevent wind rock. Herbaceous perennials and some grasses can be tidied up but remember good quality flowerheads and seed pods can look very attractive throughout the winter especially on frosty mornings as well as providing a food source for wildlife.

Leaves should be raked up and turned into valuable leaf mould.

This can be done by stacking them in a wire netting enclosure and occasionally turning them or putting them in black bin bags with some moisture and once tied pierce the bag with a fork. Running the rotary mower over them first creates greater surface area and speeds up decomposition.

Bulb planting: this is a good time to get tulips planted either in the soil or in containers (perforated pond containers are particularly good) which can then be plunged into the ground and lifted out after flowering plus, of course, planting up ornamental containers for display.

The vegetable plot: press on with the winter cultivations provided the ground conditions are not too wet. This allows as much time as possible for frosts to help break down the clods of soil in advance of sowing/planting next year. No dig beds can be cleaned of any weed/crop residue and a substantial layer of compost placed on top of the bed. Ensure that any perennial weeds are thoroughly removed. The earliest

broad beans and peas can still be obtained from November sowings using the correct varieties, i.e. Aquadulce Claudia for the beans and Onward or Feltham First for peas. Soil should be prepared as normal but avoid adding any fertiliser as a compact, hard (tough) plant will withstand the winter weather better. It is still not too late for garlic to be planted.

Fruit: winter pruning can commence this month apples, pears and soft fruits such as the currants, gooseberries, raspberries, etc. But not plums, gages and cherries which are susceptible to silver leaf disease if pruned now. Wait until the sap is rising in spring /early summer to prune and cuts will then 'gum' over and prevent the fungal spores entering through the pruning

cut.

The greenhouse: this can be cleared, cleaned thoroughly, and prepared for winter. Why not try some winter lettuce/salad leaves? Winter Gem is an excellent small cos variety and can be planted either in the soil or in gro-bags. Three or four well rooted strawberry runners can also be planted in a gro-bag or container and these will produce early strawberries in 2024.

Conveyancing Conundrums

This column is, of course, no substitute for obtaining legal advice and can only give generic advice that may be of use and interest to a number of readers.

What is a "Party Wall"?

I've been asked by a reader what is meant by the term Party Wall and how this affects the ability to do work on your own property. A Party Wall is a section of wall (or fence) that separates two adjoin-

ing properties. The wall can either stand on both sides of the boundary line or can stand on one neighbour's land but is used by both properties.

If you plan to carry out building or maintenance work to the party wall, then you must follow the process set out in the Party Wall etc. Act 1996. This doesn't apply to minor work such as replastering walls, attaching shelves, replacing / fixing electrical sockets /wiring etc.

Serve written notice on all neighbours who share the party wall 2-12 months before you plan to start the work.

If your property is leasehold, serve the notice on <u>all</u> owners.

If you can't identify all the owners despite extensive searches, attach the notice to a visible part of the building.

Explain in the notice what the works are that you propose to do, the start date for the work and the timescales involved.

Your neighbour can either provide their consent by signing the notice and returning it, propose an alternative plan or refuse consent.

If your neighbour doesn't respond within 14 days or refuses consent, this creates a party wall dispute.

If you can't resolve the party wall dispute between yourselves, an independent surveyor will need to be appointed to settle the dispute and draw up an agreement for the work. You will need to cover these costs.

If you don't follow the above process correctly, then your neighbour can challenge the works that you carry out to the party wall and this can lead to significant costs to you.

Dear Everyone,

These shorter days mean more television-watching in the evenings and, amongst other things, I have been struck by the Poppy Appeal this month. O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,

and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

May we never forget those who gave and give their lives in wars and let us always pray for peace.

THE CLIMATE CRISIS: SOMERSET RESPONDS

Everyone will know that among the biggest longterm challenges we face are the changing climate and associated loss of biodiversity. Here in Somerset people are doing what they can to help slow

and hopefully reverse these processes. On 6 June the new Somerset Council unanimously approved a county-wide Tree Strategy. This has five main themes, one of which is to plant 240 hectares of new trees and woodland each year over the next decade, from 2023-2033. The aim is to increase Somerset's tree cover from the current 8 % to somewhere close to the UK national average of 13 %. At the formal launch of the Tree Strategy (at Monks Yard, Ilminster) on 8 September Stowey Green Spaces Group were invited to give a presentation on how our community has responded to the need for more trees. Other presentations included "Reimagining the Levels," South Petherton's "Trees and Wildlife Group" (appropriately abbreviated to TWiG) and "Green Ilminster." Since 2000, when Nether Stowey Primary School children nurtured and planted the saplings that have since become Stowey Millennium Wood, volunteers from in and around the Stoweys have planted around 2500 trees, in the Millennium Wood, with its Diamond Jubilee and Platinum Jubilee extensions, in Stowey Wood itself and along the A39 Bypass. It is hoped that many more will be planted, including an extension westward from Stowey Wood, as soon as Somerset Council finalize their management plan for land at New Stowey farm.

On 14 October Stowey Green Spaces, under the auspices of the Somerset Wildlife Trust, were also present at a "Wilder Somerset 2023" conference at Bridgwater's Canalside Conference Centre. A series of inspiring talks from volunteer organizations

included presentations from the Chardstock Group's "Kit Brook River Restoration" project to "Greener and Wilder Blagdon Hill," Eaton Village Wildlife Group, Wilder Buckland and the amazing work done by Transition Town Wellington. The afternoon session ended with a choice of activities, with a large group opting for a guided walk of the Bridgwater Meads Eco Park. Plans and strategies are of course all very well, but the real challenge is to put them into practice. It is uplifting that so many people in towns and villages around the County are taking matters into their own hands, often prompted by or with the support of their Parish Councils, local landowners and farmers, to "green" their surroundings in a bid to help nature recover. It's a massive task, and time is of the essence, but every individual contribution is worthwhile and can help make a difference.
